



Release Notes for Patch Release #2288

December 1, 2014

Security Patch Release

This Patch Release addresses critical vulnerabilities; please consider deploying it as soon as possible. Not deploying this Patch Release may result in remote service exploitation, security threats to users and exposure of sensitive data.

Detailed vulnerability descriptions will be publicly disclosed no earlier than five (5) working days after public availability of this Patch Release. There is no indication that one or more of these vulnerabilities are already getting exploited or that information about them is publicly circulating.

2 Bugs fixed since previous Public Release

This document provides a summary of bugfixes and changes that have been applied subsequently to shipping Patch Release #2263.

35512 CVE-2014-8993

CVSSv2: 5.7

35470 Creating subfolders under IMAP public folders not possible

Wrong check if parent folder is a public PIM folder.

Solution: Fixed check whether parent folder is a public PIM folder.

35468 Error when processing folder synchronization in Outlook

Certain HTTP client implementation cannot properly deal with a 102 status code response while waiting for data. Therefore the "blacklist" of clients has been extended to avoid connection losses during data transfer.

35422 Incorrect z-index for extended task information area

When creating a new task and switching to expanded view, clicking on the links for the day of repetition triggers errors with overlapping elements. This has been solved by removing legacy code.

35393 Tooltip shows wrong number of files in Drive folder

In case custom storage backends are used, the amount of files per folders may be incorrectly displayed. This has been solved by accessing the correct data pool to get this information.

35176 EAS provisioning profile cannot be signed

To allow quick and flawless rollout of EAS provisioning profiles, the profile generator now allows to include intermediate certificates when cryptographically signing the profile.

35138 Reliability issues with EAS on Windows Phone 8.1

Certain synchronisation settings have not been stored within the users session. Therefore synchronisation cycles could trigger burst requests that lead concurrency issues with the sync client. This has been solved by correctly storing and restoring such information for each sync session.

32797 Incorrect unique identifier used when synchronising distribution lists in Outlook

When synchronising distribution lists, unique identifiers of list members got lost in some cases since they have been looked up at the wrong folder. This has been solved by checking all relevant folders for those identifiers.

34921 Problem when using Open option for attachments in an email

HTML sanitizing has been applied to XML content although inappropriate.

Solution: Do not generally apply HTML sanitizing to XML content if not intended to be displayed inline.

3 Changes relevant for Administrators

3.1 Changes of Configuration Files

Change #2297 Option to add intermediate certificates when signing provisioning profiles

Added the property `com.openexchange.mobile.configuration.generator.PemFile` (Default: empty) to `eas-provisioning.properties` file that specifies the `"-certfile"` argument for the OpenSSL call.

4 Tests

Not all issues that got resolved with this Patch Release could be reproduced within the OX QA lab. Therefore, we advise guided and close monitoring of the reported issue when deploying to a staging or production environment.

To avoid side effects, the shipped packages have gone through automated regression test on both, a Continuous Integration System and a dedicated server setup for system and integration testing.

All changes have been checked for potential side-effects and effect on behavior. Unless explicitly stated within this document, we do not expect any side-effects.
